

A successful program:

- Has a relevant topic
- Is enjoyable
- Reflects the interests and needs of the members
- Reflects an awareness of chapter demographics
- Includes personal experiences to emphasize key points
- Refrains from lecture/in-service type presentations
- Encourages member participation
- Is respectful of time
- Provides pertinent data for members to use at a later date.

A successful presentation:

- Is organized
- Has a presenter:
 - *with sound and thorough subject knowledge
 - *is conscientious of time
 - *is aware of audience demographics
- Has well prepared materials
- Includes ice breakers or other interactive activity that encourages veteran and new member interaction
