Examples of good goal statements taken from 2018 submissions.

“My strong desire to expand my design skills has led me to the decision to pursue a graphic design certificate from Richland Community College. The courses will assist me in reaching my goal to enhance my graphic design skills. The information from the courses will allow me to integrate technology into my instruction more effectively.”

“I will present a program on the Asheville trip to my chapter and include a quick, hands-on lesson. When substitute teaching I often give a mini-lesson in art.”

“As an English major and history minor in my undergraduate studies, I find that this program contains many opportunities for learning about an area which I have never explored.”

“My goal is to broaden my understanding of these varied cultures. This is an exceptional learning opportunity to expand my horizons. This journey will be a lifelong personal benefit for me.”

“The Executive Leadership Immersion will take me to the next level and focus on leadership skills to challenging situations”.

“This experience will aid me in my ancestral search as several lines of my family arrived in the US from Scotland in the 1600's. We have planned an additional 2 days for genealogy research after the tour.”

“My ultimate goal in my studies is to achieve my Masters of Mathematics Teaching Degree. The course I have completed thus far have been most beneficial in my teaching practices in my classroom. I feel that by completing this program, my goal to be a “Master Teacher” will be accomplished.”
