If you have not had a chance to do so, take a minute to visit the TSO website at www.dkgtexas.org for the latest news and information. If you will search under our Communications and Publicity committee page, you will find several valuable resources as your create your newsletters.

On the page, you will find a guideline for the Five Star

SOCIAL MEDIA OPPORTUNITIES

-create a Facebook page for your chapter. You can change the privacy to just allow members to access the page, or you can open it up for the public.

GUIDELINES FOR SOCIETY GRAPHIC USE

The use of society graphics can be a tricky area to navigate. Before posting anything with the DKG or TSO logo, please make sure you read up on what is acceptable and unacceptable uses. Society graphics are copyrighted, so there are important instances where the use of them is en-

couraged as well as instances in which it is not acceptable or legal to use the images.

Find the Resources Section on the TSO website. Click on the link to Use of Society Graphics. At the end of the image gallery, there is an informative guideline for the use of the graphics. While most instances of use are acceptable, it is better to be safe than sorry and take a few minutes to verify the correct use of the our Society's images.
