Using the Correct Heading on Your Newsletter?

Please double check the heading of your newsletter. The heading must include:

- Name of the Society
- Name of the state
- Newsletter title
- Chapter name
- Chapter number
- Area number
- Geographic location
- Volume and Issue number
- Date of newsletter
- Newsletter editors name and email
- Society/State Branding

Newsletters: Hardcopy

Two hundred and sixty five chapters x five newsletters x at least two pages per newsletter = lots of paper, lots of ink, and a new printer. That is the reason you send hard copies of your chapter newsletters to TSO President Marilyn Gregory, The Lone Star News Editor Carol McMillan, the Chairman of the Communications and Publicity Committee Kim Birkelbach, your Area Coordinator and your Area Communications and Publicity Committee member.

Copyright Laws

Copyright is a law that gives the writer sole rights to the publication, production, and sale of their written work. This law prevents people from copying and using the authors original work in another publication.

*If you are not sure whether or not something is copyrighted or not, it is best not to publish, produce, or sell it.

The Use of Images

Images and photos may be used in your newsletters. However, there are rules and regulations that must be followed for them to be used correctly and legally. The TSO and International websites are great resources to refer to for the appropriate uses of images and photos.
