What is a Coordinating Council?

A group composed of chapter delegates within the same geographic area

Purposes of Coordinating Councils

Vary by council but may include the following:

- Plan joint meetings
- Plan joint activities (Founder's Day, ceremonies, luncheons, receptions)
- Plan and implement cooperative projects and programs
- Award scholarships/grants-in-aid
- Provide forum where chapter presidents and delegates may get to know each another

Members of Councils

The chapter president and at least one other member from each chapter in the council make up the membership of the council.

Council Officers

Officers of a council include:

- Chair
- Secretary
- Treasurer (required only if a council has a bank account)

The chair and any other officer of the council should be selected according to the written council rules.

Terms of office may be one year or two years.

Bank Accounts



A council bank account must have a separate employer identification number (EIN)



The council must report that number to TSO Headquarters and file a Form 990 with the IRS yearly.
