

ID Required to Vote



Make sure you have 1 of these 7 acceptable forms of photo ID.



Acceptable Alternative: Utility Bill, Bank Statement, Paycheck

For voters aged 18-69, photo ID can be expired for up to four years. For voters aged 70 and older, photo ID can be expired by any length of time if otherwise valid.

How to Vote by Mail

- Be a registered voter.
- Be 65 or older, disabled, confined in correctional facility, absent from the County on Election Day, or expected to give birth within 3 weeks of Election Day.
- Download the application.
