As the new school year begins and chapters return from summer break, now is the perfect time to hold a **RECOMMITMENT** ceremony. This ceremony includes information found on The Delta Kappa Gamma International website with organization and information provided by Texas State Organization Ceremonies Chairman Dr. Barbara Derrick (August 2023).

Materials Needed: The ceremony includes the use of battery-operated tea lights. Each member should have one. They should be displayed on a tray, in a basket, or on a table.

Prior to the ceremony, the narrator needs to have generated a list of all members and the decade in which they joined DKG. This information is often in your chapter yearbook.

The seven purposes of the Society should be printed and cut into seven pieces. Seven people should be asked to read one of the purposes.
